**COOKING HINTS** Please read carefully **LAMINGTONS**: Use butter cake mix,

uniform cutting size 1½ square cubes.

Refrigerate after cutting, before icing. Even texture with no holes in cake.

CHOCOLATE CAKE: Fine soft texture, blend cocoa with a little hot water and cool before adding to mixture.

**ORANGE CAKE**: Fine even texture, even golden-brown surface. Well flavoured with orange. Rind can be used.

**PATTY CAKES**: Moist, fine texture. Nice peak 23 to rise above paper.

**FRUIT LOAF**: Cut fruit finely, fruit must not be minced. Can contain nuts.

PLAIN SPONGE: No butter. Two layers of identical thickness. Weigh each tin to

obtain same amount in each. Should be pale colour, light and soft in texture, not sticky. No cooler marks.

PAVLOVA: Marshmallow in centre. No

SCONES: Dainty 4-5cm rounds. Uniform shape and colouring. Free from excess flour. Glaze with melted butter after cooking. Cutter should be open at top and DO NOT screw cutter. Select scones cut from the first rolling of dough.

FRUIT CAKE: Paper lining 5cm above tin. Use hands to mix ingredients. Don't scrape sides of bowl and put last bit on top of cake mix. Too hot an oven causes cracks. Wrap cake in tin foil immediately after taking from oven and allow to cool.

Remove cake from tin next day and re-wrap • 1 Teaspoon Bicarbonate Soda in foil to store. Bumping tin on table a few times helps remove air bubbles before cooking for fruit cakes and plum puddings. Make cake 21 days prior to Show.

#### **RECIPE**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 250g sultanas
- 250g chopped raisins
- 250g currants
- 125g chopped mixed peel
- 90g chopped red glace cherries
- 90g chopped blanched almonds
- 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250g plain flour
- 60g self-raising flour
- ¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon ground ginger
- ½ teaspoon ground cloves
- 250g butter
- 250g soft brown sugar
- ½ teaspoon lemon essence or finely grated lemon rind
- ½ teaspoon almond essence
- ½ teaspoon vanilla essence
- 4 large eggs

#### **METHOD**

Cut the fruit & almonds into 3-4 pieces and mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover

and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably 32 VAS Ltd Carrot & Date Muffin overnight. Competition - see recipe page

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin 20 cm square, straight sided, square cornered tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

#### **HOT TIP**

To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4 or 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 or 4 pieces.

#### VAS JUNIOR BOILED FRUIT CAKE

A competition for junior cake bakers aged under 18 on the day of their local show/field day.

#### **RECIPE**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 375g Mixed Fruit
- ¾ cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon mixed spice
- ½ cup water
- 125g butter
- ½ teaspoon bicarbonate soda
- ½ cup sherry
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons marmalade
- 1 cup self-raising flour
- 1 cup plain flour
- ¼ teaspoon salt

#### **METHOD**

Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarbonate soda and allow to cool.

Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.

Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.

# NDAS JUNIOR CHOCOLATE CAKE UN-ICED COMPETITION FOR SHOW SEASON 2025/2026 INGREDIENTS:

- 1 cup SR flour
- 1 cup castor sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

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
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




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














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
